Port of Berlin (Warnemunde), Germany**

This is the heart of Germany, with a stoic beat that echoes through grand public buildings, glorious museums and theatres, urbane restaurants, bustling pubs and raucous nightclubs. The Wall is gone but Berlin is still divided: there's a distinct segue from the glitz of the west to shabby East Berlin.



AIRPORT INFORMATION

Berlin has three airports.

Tegel (TXL) primarily serves destinations within Germany and Western Europe. Schönefeld (SXF) mostly operates international flights to/from Eastern Europe, Asia, Africa and the Americas.

The third airport is the central but tiny Tempelhof (THF) in southern Kreuzberg. It became famous as the main landing strip for Allied airlifts during the Berlin blockade of 1948-49 and now fields many regional flights. Domestic flights connect Berlin to all major German airports, usually via Tempelhof and Tegel airports.

PORT INFORMATION

Located 2.5 hours from Berlin.

Warnemunde is an old German seaside resort community that has deep water docking for cruise ships.

From Warnemunde, you can travel on the autobahn or railway to Berlin to view the Brandenburg Gate, Kaiser Wilhelm Church, Checkpoint Charlie Museum, the Reichstag and the collected wonders of the Pergamon Museum. Or stay down by the sea, and visit medieval Rostock and the spas of the Baltic shore.

TRANSPORTATION

Taxis -- Taxis are numerous and available at all times (almost). Taxi stands can be found at all main stations and airports as well as outside KADEWE and hotels. Most Berlin taxi drivers speak English, but don't take it for granted.

Public transportation -- Berlin's integrated public transport system (known as the BVG) is the best way to get about.

An interconnected three-zone system (ABC) which only requires one ticket, allows you to hop from bus to underground (U-Bahn) to surface rail (S-Bahn) and tram with one ticket. Trams are fast and convenient and small ferries will get you across Berlin's lakes.

Berlin is divided into transport zones A, B and C but for most travel purposes A and B will be sufficient.

You will soon get the hang of driving in Berlin with its wide, long avenues and main roads and civilised traffic. Right of way is to traffic coming from the right - a diamond shaped yellow sign means you have right of way.

*Remember that cycling routes are common and a cyclist going straight on has precedence at a right hand turn.

*In the East trams have the right of way.

*The ringroad is called the Berliner Ring.

Tegel (TXL)

Berlin's Tegel is a convenient, recently revamped, passenger-friendly airport with easy-reach services. You will find it a breeze to make your way to the Public Transport connections which will take you into town. City and transport maps are available at the Airport's Tourist Information Centre from Berlin Tourismus Marketing.

To get into central Berlin by bus: Bus 109, 128, X9, TXL

Bus connections to the underground and Zoo Station (central Station near the Ku'damm area) are located just outside the airport terminal.

Route 1: Bus X9 to U6 Jakob-Kaiser-Platz then change to the underground from where you can reach any destination.

Route 2: Bus X9 and 109 to the Zoologischer Garten U-Bahn (underground) and S-Bahn (surface rail).

Tourist information is available at the nearby Europa Centre and underground maps are widely displayed on ticket vending machines, in the underground and inside the trains.

Tempelhof (THF)

Tempelhof, Berlin's smallest airport lies south of the city centre on the U6 (Underground Line 6). Stadtmitte, the new city centre is only a few stops away by underground, which means you can reach the centre in 15-20 minutes.

Schönefeld (SXF)

Schönefeld is situated approximately 18 km south-east of the city centre. This is the old East Berlin Airport where most Charter Flight companies fly to. The easier way to get into town is by Airport Express which will get you to the Ku'damm in around 30 minutes. Otherwise take the 171 bus to Rudow U-Bahn station and get to the Zoo by U7 (Underground Line 7) or to to S-

Bahn (surface rail) where you can travel by S9 to Alexanderplatz.

Germany's currency is the EURO. 1 EURO is equivalent to 100 Cent.

Euro and foreign currencies, as well as other currencies, can be exchanged and used in unlimited amounts. You can get cash around-the-clock at cash machines with an EC card and with international credit cards (American Express, Visa, Diners Club, Euro Card and MasterCard), which can be used for payment practically everywhere. There is a 16% value-added tax on goods and services which is included in all prices.
